Handy new shed

EVERY KID NEEDS A SHED

Shepparton's Bourchier St Primary School students will soon be able to enjoy a purposebuilt children's shed. Situated on the school's oval, the shed will be a place for students to engage in handson learning, offering an alternative to the classbased curriculum.

Bourchier St physical education teacher Paul White said senior students would

be able to enjoy the facilities throughout the school week.

"Those kids that aren't getting the results in the classroom can come out here and have a different hands-on learning approach," he said.

"We have tried the idea before but we were only half doing it, so we thought let's do it properly and set up an area the kids can have as a space of their own."

Mr White said the school was implementing a program called Hands On Learning, which had been running in secondary schools for about 20 years.

The program offers hundreds of projects for students, providing instructions and materials to complete tasks and build things to benefit the school and students.

"It couldn't have happened
